

# **Capital Markets Snapshot**

## LWS Financial

### Week ending June 2, 2023

An agreement on the U.S. debt ceiling was approved this week by both the House and Senate ending weeks of negotiation. The deal suspends the debt ceiling limit until January of 2025 and sets a cap on non-defense spending in 2024. The May job market data had a bigger impact on the markets than the agreement in Washington as Friday's Non-Farm Payroll report surprised to the upside with an increase of 339,000 jobs versus expectations of 190,000. Key items in the report reflected a higher unemployment rate at 3.7% and a decline in hourly earnings. This combination of job growth with decreasing wage pressure is in line with the Federal Reserve's goal of reducing inflation.

#### Fixed Income Markets Overview

- Treasury yields were volatile this week but ended the week higher.
- Following the jobs report, the odds of a Fed pause in rate hikes at their June 14th meeting rose to 71% according to CME FedWatch tool.
- Other economic data during the week showed continued signs of a slowing housing market. The Case Shiller Home Price Index fell 1.1% in March and while the weekly MBA Mortgage Applications index fell 3.7%.

## **Equity Markets Overview**

- All three of the major equity indices were higher this week with the DJIA and NASDAQ both up 2.0% and the S&P up by 1.8%.
- The S&P sectors for the week were led by Consumer Discretionary up 3.3% and Real Estate rising 3.1%.
- Earnings reports continued to come in mixed. Tech
  companies Dell and Broadcom both beat
  expectations but differed in their outlook forgrowth.
  On the retail front, Nordstrom was able to beat
  expectations while Dollar General was short of
  estimates and noted a decrease in sales growth.
- As earnings season ends, analysts noted positive trends among consumer staple companies that were able to pass along price increases as well as strength in tech companies who reported strong demand for their products and services.

# **Glossary and Disclosures**

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S&P 1500 Index combines three leading indices, the S&P 500, the S&P Midcap 400, and the S&P Smallcap 600, to cover approximately 90% of U.S. equity market capitalization.

S&P 500 Index includes approximately 500 leading companies that covers approximately 80% of available U.S. equity market capitalization.

S&P 500 Growth Index is a stock index that represents the fastest-growing companies in the S&P 500 based on three factors: sales growth, ratio of earnings change to price, and

S&P 500 Value Index is a stock index that represents the companies in the S&P 500 with the most attractive valuations based on three factors; book value, earnings, and sales to price.

S&P Midcap 400 Index is distinct from the large-cap S&P 500 and designed to measure the performance of 400 U.S. mid-sized companies, which have differing liquidity and growth potential than large and small cap companies.

S&P Midcap 400 Growth Index is a stock index that represents the fastest-growing companies in the S&P Midcap 400 based on three factors: sales growth, ratio of earnings change to price, and momentum.

S&P Midcap 400 Value Index is a stock index that represents the companies in the S&P Midcap 400 with the most attractive valuations based on three factors: book value, earnings, and sales to price.

S&P Smallcap 600 Index measures the performance of 600 small-sized U.S. companies to reflect the small-cap segment of the U.S. equity market, which is typically known for less liquidity than large cap stocks.

S&P Smallcap 600 Growth Index is a stock index that represents the fastest-growing companies in the S&P Smallcap 600 based on three factors: sales growth, ratio of earnings change to price, and momentum.

S&P Smallcap 600 Value Index is a stock index that represents the companies in the S&P Smallcap 600 with the most attractive valuations based on three factors: book value, earnings, and sales to price

MSCI ACWI ex-US Index captures large and mid-cap representation across 22 of 23 Developed Markets (DM) countries (excluding the US) and 24 Emerging Markets (EM) countries.

MSCI Emerging Markets Index captures large and mid-cap representation across 24 Emerging Markets (EM) countries.

S&P GSCI is broad-based and production weighted to represent the global commodity market beta. The index is designed to be investable by including the most liquid commodity futures.

S&P GSCI Gold a sub-index of the S&P GSCI, provides investors with a reliable and publicly available benchmark tracking the COMEX gold future.

Bloomberg US TIPS Index consists of Inflation-Protection securities issued by the U.S. Treasury.

Bloomberg Barclays US Corporate Bond Index is the Corporate component of the U.S. Credit index and represents publicly issued U.S. corporate and specified foreign debentures and secured notes that meet the specified maturity, liquidity, and quality requirements.

Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Corporate High Yield Index covers the universe of fixed rate, non-investment grade debt.
